### Feeding and Nutrition

Its objective is to provide supplemental feeding to young malnourished children, not older than 6 years old, in different stages of malnutrition, in depressed communities in the Philippines. The Program also educates mothers on the importance of nutrition.



### Education (Scholarships & Books for Schools)

Tuition assistance and books are provided to elementary, high school, and college students. Recipients are selected on the basis of financial need, academic achievement, and leadership potential.

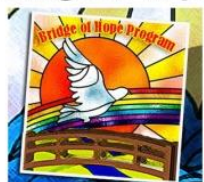
### Livelihood

It encourages overseas Filipino donors to assist in establishing small-scale or alternative income-generating activities to foster self-help among barangays, NGOs, and cooperatives. FtH started providing capital funds and grants to registered cooperatives and livestock to qualified beneficiaries.



### Bridge of Hope

Forging partnerships of U.S.- based Filipino donors with Philippine partners that advocate the charitable endeavors of their choice.



### Gift-giving

The Gift-giving projects are undertaken to address immediate needs such as shortages in food and sanitation supplies, and its activities are short-term stop-gap measures meant to bridge efforts to lead communities to self-sufficiency while recovering from calamities or confronted with long-term problems due to poverty.



### Infrastructure (Classrooms and Water Systems)

New classrooms are built on proposed sites, with CFO vetting each proposal. Confirmation of sites is principally based on student population and current classroom conditions in the area. FtH also provides potable water supply in areas with limited access to water, through the construction of artesian and deep wells, manual or electric pumps, and water tanks.



### Calamity Assistance and Rehabilitation Endeavors (CARE)

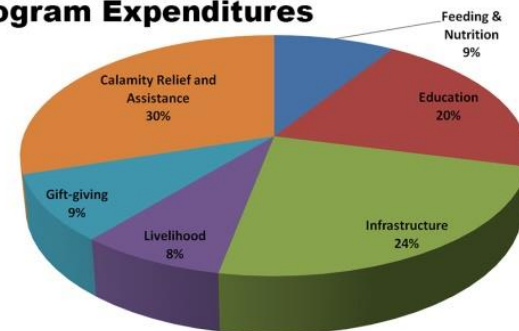
Families experiencing devastation and dislocation caused by natural disasters—typhoons, landslides, flooding, volcanic eruption, earthquake—are provided with immediate short-term measures or emergency provisions, and rehabilitation assistance to support recovery.



### Feed the Hungry Annual Special Events

- **Shindig** – a casual dinner/dance held in the Spring each year.
- **Golf Tournament** – a fun event for avid golfers, friends and supporters held in the summer.
- **Handog** – a formal gala held in the Fall at a prestigious hotel. Corporate sponsorships are welcome.
- **Celebrating Life** – all year. In lieu of gifts, on occasions like anniversaries, birthdays, and retirement, celebrants encourage their guests to donate to Feed the Hungry, Inc.

### Program Performance

- Over 5,000 malnourished children under the age of 6 benefited in 56 supplemental feeding sites
- 140 classrooms built, complete with student desks, teacher table and chair, and upgraded toilet facilities
- 14 water systems installed and improved
- 11 housing projects
- 26 livelihood projects located all throughout the Philippines
- 211 students in public and private schools, and universities given education scholarships
- 150,906 used books distributed to public schools and libraries
- 3,088 new DepEd textbooks distributed to schools where FtH classrooms were built
- 83 sets of computers and IT equipment given to schools
- 10 Braille machines given to special education schools
- 300 children provided with tuberculosis screening and treatment
- More than 100,000 families benefited from calamity relief and medical emergency assistance

# About Us

**Feed the Hungry, Inc.** (FtH) is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt, nonprofit charitable organization based in the Washington, D.C. area. Organized in 1993, FtH started as gift-giving and feeding projects for indigent children in the Philippines by a group of World Bank Group and IMF (International Monetary Fund) Filipino staff and joined by Filipino-American volunteers in the community.

Today, FtH has evolved into a vibrant, credible, and trusted multi-program organization with increasing number of volunteers from the Metro Washington, D.C. area, Hawaii, Nevada, and other parts of the United States. Volunteers and donors have been implementing FtH's projects from feeding and nutrition, education (scholarships and books), infrastructure (building classrooms and water systems), giftgiving (orphanages, homes for the aged), livelihood, and calamity relief and rehabilitation endeavors, mainly directed to help alleviate poverty and improve the economic conditions of the poorest of the poor in the Philippines, and extended to other countries and locally.

### Feed the Hungry Team

Feed the Hungry, Inc. is an all-volunteer organization administered by a Board of Directors. The Executive Director is responsible for the operation and execution of programs. Funds raised are spent on programs that directly benefit recipients in the Philippines and the United States. Members of the Board and program directors who participate in program activities in the Philippines pay for their own travel and board and lodging.
